

## **Scholarship Helps Trompke Pursue Pilot Dream**

Wes Trompke, a 2023 Loomis High School graduate, is soaring toward his lifelong dream of becoming a pilot. He is a sophomore at Oklahoma State University (OSU) majoring in professional piloting and thriving in one of the nation's top flight programs.

"So far, it's been awesome," Wes said. "It's been everything I ever dreamed of. Since I can remember, I've always wanted to be a pilot."

His education is supported by the 2024 Mike Lane Memorial Scholarship, one of the many scholarship funds held at the Phelps County Community Foundation. The scholarship is an honor that holds personal significance for Wes.

"I was really excited to receive that scholarship," Wes said. "It helps me out a lot, and I felt really happy that I could represent Mike's name and pursue anything in the aviation world around him."

Although Trompke never met Mike Lane, he knew of him through family connections. Mike Lane (1969-2007) was a respected aircraft mechanic and Holdrege native, known for his passion for aviation and adventure. He graduated from Holdrege High School in 1988 and graduated with honors from Cheyenne AeroTech in Wyoming. He worked as an airline mechanic in Oakland, Calif.; Indianapolis, Ind.; and Chicago. He died unexpectedly on Nov. 25, 2007.

Wes has built a strong relationship with

Mike's brother, Jeff Lane, who lives nearby in Tulsa and has provided guidance and mentorship in his aviation journey.

"Jeff's a really good guy, and he's helped me a lot," Wes said. "He's a pilot and director of operations for a corporate flying service out of Tulsa, so when I was working on my private license, he gave me pointers and helped me prepare for my tests."

Wes is the son of Carrie and Justin Trompke. He developed a passion for aviation from his father, who also has a pilot's license.

"I've always just loved to fly," Wes said. "The thrill of flying has always been fun, and I've always liked to learn things with my dad."

Wes, who already holds a private pilot's license, is now working on additional certifications, including his instrument rating and commercial licenses. He's considering a career in corporate or private flying but is also intrigued by the cropdusting industry after gaining experience with Nebraskaland Aviation in Holdrege this past summer.

"There's a lot of opportunity in the pilot world," he said.

Wes said he loves Phelps County and is hopeful that someday he can return to the area to live and work.



## **PCCF Grants Save Lives With New EMS Radios**

Phelps County Emergency Management Services received a much-needed boost to its communication capabilities, thanks to a generous grant from the Phelps County Community Foundation. PCCF grants helped purchase state-of-the-art Motorola APX 8000 dual-band radios to improve communications during critical situations.

Tori Johnston, Phelps County's Deputy Emergency Manager, said the new radios became necessary when some law enforcement agencies switched to digital radios.

Before the new radios, Phelps County's volunteer fire departments relied solely on analog signal radios, which limited their ability to communicate with departments that had transitioned to digital systems. This left EMS, fire, and emergency management teams unable to hear vital communication from law enforcement while responding to emergency calls. Instead, they had to rely on dispatchers to relay information.

"This left our EMS and Fire and Emergency Management departments in the dark when responding," Johnston said.

The new radios have other lifesaving advantages in rural areas and when communicating with law enforcement agencies outside Phelps County.

"The signal on the digital system is much better and stronger," Johnston said. "There are times when calls are in the rural areas of a pasture, which have very little signal, and to speak with law enforcement or dispatch all you would hear is static. In a moment's notice, it is hard to reach for a cell phone when in full bunker gear to get additional help if needed."

With the PCCF grants and other funding, 16 radios were purchased and distributed among fire chiefs, assistant chiefs, and assistant unit captains at volunteer fire departments in Holdrege, Bertrand, Loomis and Funk. Two radios were retained for the Phelps County Emergency Management Department.

The new radios have already made a lasting impact on Phelps County's emergency response capabilities, ensuring that first responders can communicate efficiently, safely, and effectively. With stronger signals, crossagency coordination, and realtime communication with law enforcement, radios are now a crucial tool in keeping the community safe.

## Free Book Program Inspires Love of Reading In Local Kids

The Phelps County Community Foundation continues to be a local program partner with The Dollywood Foundation to bring Dolly Parton's Imagination Library program to Phelps County. Children registered in the program receive a free book in the mail each month until they turn five. The last book a child receives when they "graduate" from the program focuses on preparing them for kindergarten.

Carson Ward, 5, of Holdrege was one of the first participants of this program when PCCF brought it to Holdrege.

His mom, Jessica, said Carson was excited to have a package arrive in the mail each month with his name on it.

"It's usually just mom and dad who got mail, but he was so excited to open his own mail," Jessica said.

His excitement continued when he opened a new book just for him.

"We have a lot of books, but a lot of them are hand-me-down books from his older brother," Jessica said. "These were nice because they were brand new to him. It gave him a variety of books instead of just the same all the time."

Jessica said reading is important to her, and she believes the book program instills a love of reading in kids at a young age.
